



EOS Worldwide IP and Branding Guidelines

This site summarizes the guidelines for the proper use of Entrepreneurial Operating System (EOS®) intellectual property by EOS Implementers.

All EOS Implementers must follow these guidelines when using EOS intellectual property and brand assets in your Implementer business.

Non-EOS Implementers, spin-off businesses, software application developers, third-party partners, and others may not use any of our intellectual property without the express permission of EOS Worldwide.

Self-Implementers can discuss our intellectual property when teaching EOS to their employer and its employees, but cannot use our intellectual property outside of such discussions.

Helping Entrepreneurs through EOS

If you want to help entrepreneurs by using concepts found in the Traction library or EOS Worldwide content, you may do so in 2 ways:

1. As an EOS Implementer



a. Pure implementation of EOS, meaning:

i. Guiding a leadership team through the EOS Process from start (90-minute meeting) to finish (your client's graduation day);

ii. Teaching all of the tools in the EOS Toolbox, without:

1. adding in content of your own or from some other system and calling it EOS;
2. removing or re-ordering the steps in the process
3. adding in steps that are not part of the EOS Process as defined in the EOS Toolbox, Base Camp videos and guides, or the books in the Traction Library.

b. Honor our IP/Branding Guidelines, branding.eosworldwide.com (<https://branding.eosworldwide.com/>)

2. As a consultant or coach integrating EOS concepts into your other materials

a. Need to give credit where credit is due



c. Honor our IP/Branding Guidelines, branding.eosworldwide.com (<https://branding.eosworldwide.com/>)

d. You can't alter EOS Tools in any way.

e. Use only a handful (1-3) of the EOS Tools. When you start teaching substantially more or all of the foundational Tools, it feels more like Option 1 than Option 2.
